Altar Servers

Altar servers assist the priest and the congregation in the celebration of the Liturgy of the Mass, special Liturgies and celebrations, and the celebration of the sacraments.

They are blessed to have an intricate role in the Mass, assisting with specific actions and setting an example to the whole of the congregation by their active participation in the Liturgy.

It is hoped that the tasks they assist with will help to draw all of us to participate in an intimate way during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and to desire unity with Jesus Christ. Altar servers assist the priest with various details so that the priest may give full attention to presiding at the liturgy.

The Altar Servers various tasks include assisting the priest with the Missal and Sacramentary, helping to set the altar table with the necessary vessels, and handling candles, incense, the processional cross and other sacramental.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are people in our parish who have been appointed to assist our priests, (the Ordinary Ministers of the Eucharistic), to facilitate the distribution of Holy Communion within Mass. These parishioners are very ordinary people who:

- are practicing Catholics, distinguished in their Christian life, faith and morals
- are at least 18 years old
- have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- strive to demonstrate a deep reverence for and devotion to the holy Eucharist
- possess the requisite abilities and temperament to carry out their assigned duties.

Some of our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion also administer Holy Communion outside of the Mass to those in their homes who are impeded from attending Mass because of sickness - physical or mental ill health. They do not take their Ministry for granted but rather feel very humbled and privileged in having the honour of sharing in the celebration of the Eucharist and in the distribution of Holy Communion to fellow parishioners - they recognize the Body of Christ in those to whom they serve. Karate Club

A rota is prepared on a three-monthly basis for the Sunday and Vigil Masses and is circulated to readers either in paper copy or by email.

St Joseph's Pre-school Playgroup opened in October 1984 and caters for younger children, 3 to 4 year olds. Our aim is to develop the children's social, emotional and physical skills by offering them an opportunity to mix with other children their own age.

We are opened four days a week, Tuesday to Friday. Our session starts at 9am and finishes at 12pm. We follow the national curriculum, which enhances the structure of the Playgroup. The children have access to a variety of activities such as water, sand, construction, puzzles, drawing and painting as well as imaginary play in the house corner with dressing up clothes etc. The children also have access to the large hall where they can play on the climbing frame, bicycles, with balls, hoops and large building blocks. We end our session everyday with songs, rhymes and a story.

Many visitors call to the playgroup. These visitors include Road Safety, Community Police, Fire Brigade and a Librarian. We also have Elaine who comes once a term to provide a pre-school music and movement session for us. Mini- the Musical Monkey invites your child to join in an interactive class that introduces music and movement in an active, fun, educational and child friendly way.

The Playgroup is monitored by Social Services. The staff are fully trained and committed to making sure your child's first steps into a pre-school setting are happy and enjoyable.

The Bethany Bereavement Support Group

Bethany is a voluntary parish based ministry, which aims to help the bereaved and grieving. The name Bethany recalls the visit of Jesus to Mary and Martha on the death of their brother Lazarus.

Although grieving is a natural process which can be helped by the sympathy and understanding of friends, sometimes one may need support to work through it in a positive way.

Friends don't always know how to help; they may be embarrassed by one's grief; they may even avoid meeting one in the mistaken belief that a meeting may increase distress. It is quite normal to feel anger, guilt, fear and depression as well as the awful pain of loss. These feelings need to be expressed rather than repressed, to be talked out, cried over and put in some sort of perspective.

It helps the healing process to talk with a trained listener and confront the very strong feelings associated with grief. Many Bethany members have themselves been bereaved. They are trained to listen with understanding. They accept those suffering loss as they are, and support them through the grieving process.


The Order of the Knights of St. Columbanus, Drumbo and Carryduff
